Marriage as a Mission of Service

"Everyone then who hears these words of mine and does them will be like a wise man who built his house upon the rock; and the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat upon that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded on the rock." Matthew 7:24-25

Building a strong foundation is the most important step for everything, but especially for relationships. The strongest marriages are based not only on love for each other but also on a mutual love of God. The story of 4thcentury St. Julian and St. Basilissa illustrates this beautifully. Through their union, they dedicated their lives to God and spent their time together in service to the poor and sick. Upon marriage, they distributed their property among the poor. They converted their house into

a kind of hospital, in which they housed anyone in need. St. Julian primarily cared for the men, and St. Basilissa for the women. To all, they were seen as models of charity, detachment from worldly goods, and joy.

Under the Roman emperor Diocletian, they underwent great persecution, but they never let it sway their faithfulness. Basilissa passed away peacefully, while Julian faced martyrdom for refusing to renounce his faith.

Their example reminds us that marriage is a mission, one rooted in love, sacrifice, and faith. Here in our communities, we are blessed with many faithful couples who also live out this mission.

This April, Mike and Aggie will celebrate their 49th wedding anniversary. For nearly five decades, this couple has lived out their marriage by serving others and sharing their love and hope with those around them.
