Born in Florence, Italy in 1515, St. Philip Neri was a mystic and a missionary, a priest and a prophet, a founder of the Oratory and a healer of souls. He lived during a time when there was a great need for reform

and spiritual renewal. St. Philip Neri was able to bring a renewal, thanks to God's help and his affable manner. People were drawn to his solid faith which he exhibited in the friendly and joyful way he encountered others. "In dealing with

Bill and his wife of 56 years, Kathi, loved the work of Catholic Social Services. They both served on the CSS Celebration of Caring committee and would often drop off fresh produce from their garden for our

clients. Bill and his friends

played in the CSS Memorial Golf Tourney each year, often being the first to sign up. He loved travelling around the world with Kathi, his family and friends. He was especially proud of his daughters,

Dana and Dionne, and loved spending time with

them, his sons-in-law Lee and Wade, and his grandchildren Grant, Will, Zach, Taylor and Stephanie.

For 48 years, Bill was a Professor in the UNL Department of Communication Studies, serving as Department chair for 21 years, retiring in 2020. In his nearly half century of service to the department, Bill was recognized by his peers with a long list of professional awards. But his greatest
