Tithing comes in many forms but the donation of grain from our Indigo Ridge Farms was the perfect opportunity to help others in the St. Gianna Program. We love the support of women and kids. It also reminds us how our moms helped neighbors better their lives." The McDonalds draw inspiration from Ecclesiastes 11:4: "If you wait for perfect weather, you will never plant your seeds. If you are afraid that every cloud will bring rain, you will never harvest your crops."

#### How to Donate Grain to Catholic Social Services of Southern Nebraska

- 1. Choose the Donation Amount: Farmers decide on the quantity of grain to donate to CSS. This could be a portion of their harvest, surplus grain, or a dedicated contribution for the season.
- 2. **Notify the Grain Elevator**: Work with your local grain elevator to initiate the donation. Notify them in advance that you'd like to transfer ownership of specific grain to Catholic Social Services of Southern Nebraska. The grain should be directed to CSS's account at the elevator.
- 3. **Ensure Proper Documentation**: Request that the grain elevator provides documentation verifying the quantity and type of grain donated. Both CSS and the farmer should keep copies of all documentation.
- 4. **Coordinate with CSS**: Notify CSS of your donation and provide any necessary documentation or confirmation. CSS will help facilitate the process and can issue a receipt, acknowledging the farmer's generosity.
- 5. **Consult with a Tax Professional**: It's wise to consult with a tax advisor before making a grain donation. This ensures compliance with IRS regulations and helps farmers maximize their tax benefits.

Donating grain is a simple yet powerful way to live out the values of compassion, generosity, and faith, all while strengthening the Southern Nebraska community and bringing more Hope in the Good Life. **St. Isidore, patron saint of farmers, pray for us!**
