In 2002, Jose began volunteering in the food pantry of Catholic Social Services in Lincoln, located at the Blessed John XXII Center at the time. Jose had a deep passion for the mission of Catholic Social Services, and for feeding the hungry. He developed relationships with local food sources, including three Panera Bread locations, setting up weekly donations from these businesses. Jose convinced the former Ideal Grocery store

and cheese at a price just above cost. He identified local areas of need and made the food deliveries to them three times a week. He made sure that everyone receiving assistance was aware that it came from Catholic Social Services in the

hopes of attracting interest in the Faith he so loved.

Jose continued to volunteer after the CSS Lincoln offices moved to 23rd and O Street. He added teaching English once weekly at our Guadalupe Center at the CSS O Street location. Jose loved to give a tour of our pantry and was especially proud of our walk-in freezer!

When CSS moved to the O Street location, the bread donations continued from Panera. Volunteers would pick up the items in the evening after business hours. They had access to the CSS office and would drop the bread off in the food pantry. When training volunteers for this process, Jose made it a point to tell them to be sure to stop and visit Jesus in the chapel. He wanted these volunteers who were bringing bread for the nourishment of our clients to visit the Bread of Life for *their* nourishment.

Our good friend Jose passed away on June 16, 2021. He is survived by his wife, Mary, and their children Katie and Matthew.
