Shortly after, their fifth child was born. He had accepted a job at Chase County Community Hospital but arrived with no furniture, no car, and nowhere to stay. What he did have was faith and a deep trust that the Church would be there for him. While still in

Nigeria, Francis searched online for the local parish and found Father Gilde at St. Patrick's Church. He called and introduced himself, not knowing what would come of it but trusting that God would provide.

Bill Sullivan, Imperial Thrift Store Manager, stepped in to help Francis and his family get the resources they needed. Through the store, they received car seats,

kitchen items, furniture, and more. When Francis needed a vehicle but did not yet have a credit history, parishioner Dan Russell stepped in to guarantee a loan.

"There is a difference between wants and needs," Francis said. "The need came at the right time, and that is how you know God is really working."

A few months later, Aloysius Aleke, a fellow Catholic medical laboratory scientist from Nigeria, arrived in the United States hoping to reunite with his wife and

daughter who were already here. He reached out to Francis, who helped connect him to the hospital in Imperial to begin working. Aloysius received help and necessities from St. Isidore Gift & Thrift Store which helped him begin his new life. "Wherever I go, I see the Catholic Church as my home," he shared. "I find peace there. Everything that happens in one's life is always to the
