## An encounter through serving

Saint Vincent Pallotti was a radical for his times.

Born in Rome in 1795, Vincent began studying for the priesthood at an early age. He did well in his studies, being ordained at the age of twenty-three and earning his doctorate in theology soon after. Vincent was named as an assistant professor at Sapienza University but soon resigned it shortly after to devote himself to pastoral work.

Saint Vincent was known for the "extreme" idea of approaching the "faithful of every class, rank, and condition" to minister to "those who are most spiritually needy." He sought people to treat those in need "with care and with a loving and tender concern." He organized schools for shoemakers, tailors, coachmen, carpenters, and gardeners so that they could better work at their trade, as well as evening classes for young farmers and unskilled workers. He quickly became known as a "second St. Philip Neri." He gave away his books, his possessions, and even his clothes to the poor.

He called the laity, sisters, priests, and brothers, to charity, patience, humility, zeal, and love of God and of Jesus Christ.
