St. Faustina joined the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy, where she experienced profound visions of Jesus.

Through these encounters, Jesus revealed the depth and magnitude of His Divine Mercy, calling the world to healing, love, and compassion.

This message of mercy inspires and encourages us to live out Jesus' command in Luke's Gospel: "Be merciful, even as your Father in Heaven is merciful" (Luke 6:36).

In addition to providing food, clothing, furniture, and shelter, CSS serves a steady stream of individuals and families in need of assistance with rent, utilities, medical bills, or car repairs.

People come to us from all walks of life, including many single mothers, with barely enough

income to pay their bills.
A single unexpected event occurs, such as reduced hours at work, their car stops running, or they undertake a serious illness which requires doctors visits, and they are plunged into overwhelming uncertainty and a downward financial spiral.

Often, they are burdened by multiple adversities at the same time and ask for help to escape the cycle of juggling bills screaming the loudest – rent, electric, car repair or medical.

#### Lisa's Story

"Lisa", a 30-year-old single mother with a daughter in fourth grade, is expecting a baby in two months. Her pregnancy has been difficult and caused her to miss work for doctor appointments and medical interventions. Because of this, she lost her job last July. The child's father is incarcerated so there is no child support. Lisa's only income comes from Medicaid and food stamps. She used her final paycheck to cover part of her rent, but by August, she was facing eviction. She was also behind on a car loan and feared repossession. FSS stepped in, covered a month's rent, and kept eviction at bay. This gave Lisa a reprieve and space to focus on finding a new job, giving her a chance to get back on top of her finances.

#### Alyssa's Story

"Alyssa", a 50-year-old single mother with a 13-year-old son and 12-year-old daughter, has been struggling to pay rent after being diagnosed with congestive heart failure, which has prevented her from working. She has applied for and is hoping to receive disability assistance. FSS provided a month's rent to help Alyssa and her children while they wait for the outcome of her disability application.

Thanks to the generosity of our donors, stories like Lisa's and Alyssa's are possible. Through ongoing support, we are able to carry out our mission daily, providing compassion to families in their most vulnerable moments.
